A fallen Police Officer



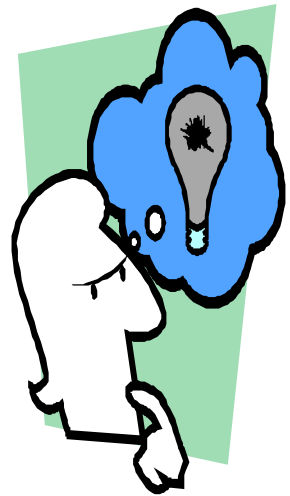
On November 6, 1999, State Trooper Frederick A. Hardy died of injuries suffered in a hit-and-run, while exiting his patrol car after making a traffic stop on the Interstate. Trooper Hardy joined the state police in 1990, and had accomplishments as a Father, Husband, Police Officer, and a Marine Corps Veteran.

A suspect in the case was located after the suspect's sister, from whom he had borrowed the car, heard news reports about the crash that included a description of the vehicle according to broadcast reports. After the car was returned to the woman she saw it had been damaged and called police. The suspect was charged with manslaughter, drunken driving, fleeing the scene of a crash, and driving with a suspended license.
